From the Executive Director

I have now been the Executive Director of SEPSEA for several months. During this time, I have had the opportunity to meet numerous times with our board of directors and executive board. I also attended the State of the Art conference in Syracuse, participated with Think College in numerous meetings, and represented SEPSEA at the DCDT and DADD conferences. The past several months have been a growing period for SEPSEA. The founders of SEPSEA laid a strong foundation for the organization to move forward, and as a result, we are truly becoming the professional development organization that was intended. Our Board of Directors and Executive Board have met several times and agreed on an agenda that will enable SEPSEA to provide critical professional development to existing and newly established IPSE programs and help develop new programs. Many SEPSEA committees have been meeting regularly to carry out specific committee assignments. If you are interested n serving on a committee, please let us know; committees are our mechanism for doing the SEPSEA work. Our website is being updated regularly, and we have transferred to Wild Apricot, a software program for membership and other organizational activities.

SEPSEA wants to support strong state alliances; our ultimate goal is for all four and two-year colleges and universities in the southeast to have IPSE programs. While this may be a difficult-to-achieve goal, we want to expand our region's network of programs as much as possible. SEPSEA is moving from an institutional-based organization to an individual-based program, meaning that we will no longer have institutional membership; SEPSEA will comprise individual members. The SEPSEA board believes that an individual-based membership will be more robust and sustainable in carrying out the organization's work. The SEPSEA Chair, Kristin Johnson, and I have also been involved with Think College in developing additional regional alliances. While our primary mission is to provide professional development for states and programs in the southeast, we are also working with other regional alliances to create a solid national support network. With the support of Think College, regional and state alliances, young adults with intellectual disabilities will have many opportunities to participate in IPSE programs.

Our annual SPESEA conference will be in Nashville May 18-19. Many thanks to Misty Parsley for chairing the conference committee as part of her responsibilities as vice chairperson for professional development. Please try to attend if possible; registration and lodging are available on the SEPSEA website. We are also working with Think College to host a summit focusing on historically black colleges and universities (HBCUs). This meeting will be in Atlanta in August. We want to expand IPSE programs to HBCUs in the southeast.

As Executive Director, I work for the board and carry out any duties and responsibilities I am assigned. Please feel free to contact me about anything you need from SEPSEA. The Board of Directors look forward to providing you with as much support as you need to make your programs even more exemplary than they already are.
